WHEREAS, the Town Boards of Wolcott and Huron have created sewer districts in their respective municipalities

necessary for the con-struction of this project and now intend to pursue CWSRF financing for the cost of constructing the sanitary sewers to serve the two sewer districts;

WHEREAS, each year the Town contributes \$30,000 to our Town Hall Building Capital Project Fund; and WHEREAS, as said fund is used for necessary building upgrades and improvements; and WHEREAS, the Town again has included this funding in the 2015 budget;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the clerk to the Supervisor is authorized to transfer \$30,000 from General Checking to Building Capital CD.
