- 1. Don stated he attended code school last week but found only the last class to be somewhat beneficial but he now has his 24 hours of training required for the year.

WHEREAS, the Code Enforcement Officer has reviewed said project and feels a negative declaration is in order; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board concurs with the Code Enforcement Offi-cer and sees no negative impact environmentally;

1. Kim updated the board on the Blind Sodus Bay and Port Bay Sewer Projects. As soon as the weather breaks, Blind Sodus Bay will get underway and, hopefully, the Port Bay Project breaking ground by Spring 2016. Also, the town's sewer law is in the works with the details still being ironed out.

RESOLUTION #24-15 TOWN OF WOLCOTT PORT BAY SEWER DISTRICT LATERAL RESTRICTIONS RESOLUTION -

The following resolution was presented by Kim Park, moved by Chris Loveless, seconded by Russ Freer,

WHEREAS, the Town of Wolcott and the Town of Huron are working in conjunction to plan and construct sanitary sewer improvements in an area surrounding Port Bay, referred to as the "Joint Port Bay Sanitary Sewer Project;"

RESOLUTION - (cont'd)

WHEREAS, with regard to the portion of the service area within the Town of Wolcott, the Town Board of the Town of Wolcott has created the Port Bay Sewer District pursuant to Town Law for the express purpose of extending sanitary sewer service to residents along portions of West Port Bay Road, East Port Bay Road, Tompkins Point Road, North Maple Street, Woodtract Road, Roney Road, Martin Road, Cardinal Road and Furnace Road, in addition to smaller private drives and easement areas near Port Bay; and

WHEREAS, part of the land area within the Port Bay Sewer District is also within Wayne County Agricultural District No. 1, specifically along portions of West Port Bay Road, East Port Bay Road, and North Maple Road; and

filed WHEREAS, the Town Board has а Notice Action to Undertake an Within Agricultural District to evaluate the impact providing sanitary sewer service within this area on lands within Agricultural District No. 1; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Markets Agriculture and ("Department") has about the expressed concern potential impact that said sanitary sewer service is likely to have on agriculture within the Agricultural District.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board, in recognition of the concerns that have been raised, hereby resolves to adopt the "Lateral Restriction - Conditions on Future Service" specified by the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets as follows:

<u>Lateral Restriction - Conditions on Future Service</u>

The Town of Wolcott imposes the following conditions, as warranted or recommended on the management of water/sewer lines located along <u>the portions of West Port Bay Road</u>, <u>East Port Bay Road and North Maple Street included in the Port Bay Sewer District</u>, within an agricultural district:

(1) The only land and/or structures which will be allowed to connect to the proposed waterline or sewer within an agricultural district will be existing structures at the time of

construction, further agricultural structures, and land and structures that have already been approved for development by the local governing body prior to the filing of the Final Notice of Intent by the municipality.

SUPERVISOR - (cont'd)

RESOLUTION - (cont'd)

Land and structures that have been approved for development refer to properties/structures that have been brought before a local governing body where approval (e.g., subdivision, site plan, and permit) is needed to move forward with project plans and the governing body has approved the If no local approval is required for the subdivision of land and/or the construction of structures, the municipality accepts the limitation under Public Health Law \$1115 that defines a "subdivision," in part, as "any tract of land which is divided into five or more parcels." Water and/or sewer service will not be extended to the fifth and subsequent parcels where no local approval is required and the land is located within a county adopted, State certified agricultural district.

(2) If a significant hardship can be shown by an existing resident, the lateral restriction to the resident's property may be removed by the municipality upon approval by the Department. It is the responsibility of the resident landowner to demonstrate that a hardship exists relative to his or her existing water supply or septic system and clearly demonstrate the need for public water or sewer service. The

municipality shall develop a hardship application to be filed with the municipality, approved by the County Department of Health, and agreed to by the Department of Agriculture and Markets.

- (3) If it can be demonstrated to the Department's satisfaction that the landowner requested county to remove his or her land from agricultural district at the time of district review and the county legislative body refused to do so, lateral restrictions may be removed by the municipality if the Department determines that the removal of the restriction for the subject parcel(s) would not have an unreasonably adverse effect on the agricultural district.
- (4) If land is removed from a county adopted, State certified agricultural district and district has been reviewed by the county legislative body certified and bv Commissioner modification, for lateral restrictions imposed by the municipality are no longer in effect for the parcels of land that removed from the have been agricultural district.

contractual) to the 2015 Budget and transfer \$16,250 from DA5142.1 and \$8,750 from DB5110.1 into respective added budget line items Administration contractual.

WHEREAS, Governor Cuomo and the New York State Legislature have enacted a Property Tax Freeze as part of the 2015 Budget Process; and

WHEREAS, one provision of the Property Tax Freeze/Property Tax Credit program is for Local Governments to prepare and submit a Gov-ernment Efficiency Plan by June 1, 2015; and

WHEREAS, Local Governments have the option of preparing their

own plan, or preparing a plan with other local governments; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Wolcott has reviewed the Property Tax

Freeze Credit Guidance Publication prepared by the New York State Department of Taxation and Finance; and

WHEREAS, after consideration the Wolcott Town Board has deter-mined that it desires to work with Wayne County government and other local governments that also opt to work with Wayne County to prepare and submit a consolidated Government Efficiency Plan;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town of Wolcott has de-termined it will join Wayne County Government and other local gov-ernments that also opt to join Wayne County to prepare and submit a consolidated Government Efficiency Plan; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Wolcott Town Board designates Supervisor Kim Park as a contact person and source of information for the County Administrator; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Wolcott Town Clerk will transmit a certified copy of this Resolution to the Wayne County Clerk of the Board of Supervisors.
