ASSESSOR/SUPERVISOR'S CLERK - Amber Roberts

1. Amber mentioned she had put AFLAC folders in our mailboxes and anyone interested in their presentation and possibly signing up for the program could meet with them on Monday, June 26th at 11:45AM. 2. Amber will be out of the office the entire week of July 4th. Also, their office will be closed the week of July 17th as she and Amanda will be at training in Ithaca.

3. Amber met with Ron Gill regarding the shelving in our records room in the basement. He's looking at making the layout of the shelving so it would be able to be handicapped accessible.

4. Amber referred to the Paid Family Leave Benefit Program she talked about at last month's meeting. The board needs to make a decision as to whether or not to opt in to this program. Discussion.

RESOLUTION #25-17 TOWN OF WOLCOTT TO OPT OUT OF PAID FAMILY LEAVE BENEFIT PROGRAM -

The following resolution was presented by Adam Ellis, moved by

Dan Youngman, seconded by Lynn Chatfield,

WHEREAS, the NYS Workman's Compensation Law has been amended to incorporate the new Paid Family Leave Benefit Program; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Wolcott, being a public employer, can choose whether or not to opt in to this new program; and

WHEREAS, the Wolcott Town Board, after some discussion, has made their decision based upon the information available;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Town Board of the Town of Wolcott chooses NOT to opt in to the Paid Family Leave Benefit Program.

ASSESSOR/SUPERVISOR'S CLERK - (cont'd)

5. Amber reported we are waiting for the balance of our Rural Development funding to come in for the Blind Sodus Bay Sewer Project.

HIGHWAY - Scott Maybe

1. Scott turned in a check for scrap metal for \$246.43.

2. Scott said an issue has come up with the turnaround on How-land Road. Apparently a deal had been made with the former owner, who is now deceased, but the new owners are not cooperating. They will have to figure something out.

3. Scott mentioned the electronics collected on our cleanup day should be picked up on Monday, June 26th.

CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER - Don Camp

1. Don said the information for the Blind

Sodus Bay Sewer Project is logged into the new program. The report he received from WA CO Water & Sewer Authority states there are 171 parcels in the district with 86 of them being connected and 61 of those still need to be dye-tested. Letters will be sent out giving them until Sept. 30th to get this done.

2. Don also said he is ahead of the program with getting things logged in for the Port Bay Sewer Project.

TOWN CLERK - Dawn Krul

1. The Town Clerk reported the town hall offices will be closed on Monday, July 3rd & Tuesday, July 4th for the holiday.

SUPERVISOR - Lynn Chatfield

OLD BUSINESS -

1. Assessor's/Town Clerk's records room - as mentioned earlier Ron Gill is working on this.

2. Land Use Code - Art is still trying to get to this.

3. Security System - Mark Sauer sent a proposal from Finger Lakes Security Systems. Programming fee is \$100.00. Monthly monitoring fee is \$26.50 - billed semi-annually. With nothing else to compare to, this was tabled until next month.

4. Water/Sewer Unit Charges - Amber is working on these.

5. Port Bay Sewer District/Port Bay Breach - Easements are coming along. We still have about

34 critical ones to get before going out to bid and Lori Furguson is being a great help with these. There is a meeting on Thursday with DEC regarding the breach.

6. Brown/Wadsworth Road Water District - still in USDA hands.

7. Blind Sodus Bay Water District - on back burner for now.

SUPERVISOR - (cont'd)

8. Town Cleanup Day Report - Lynn reported they started before 9 o'clock and went until 2:30. Some people waited in line for an hour and a half or more. Still others had to be turned away. The elec-tronics recycling played a major role in the turnout. Much discussion The board decided to have another cleanup day in September with the date to be determined by August's meeting. Lynn also mentioned there is grant money available for town's doing electronics recycling. Lynn will take care of filling out the paperwork and submitting it to the state.

NEW BUSINESS -

1. Lynn informed the rest of the board that Senator Pam Helming would like to have a public town hall meeting here in the near future

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR -

Lynn offered privilege of the floor. Lori Furguson said if anybody knows anyone that needs to sign an easement to please let her know and she will try to get them signed.
